RIGHT NOW BETTENDORF REQUIRES PANHANDLERS TO REGISTER WITH THE CITY AND THAT NUMBER HAS QUADRUPLED OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS.

THE CITY SAYS RESEARCH SHOWS MANY OF THOSE PANHANDLERS ARE NOT HOMELESS.
